CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 12th - 19th May

House to House Envelope Distribution

It will only involve distribution, not collection, as recipients will be invited to drop off any envelopes filled with cash directly to the Cathedral. This will be done early in Christian Aid Week, from, say, the 12th to the14th of May.
